1. Group decision and reasoning:

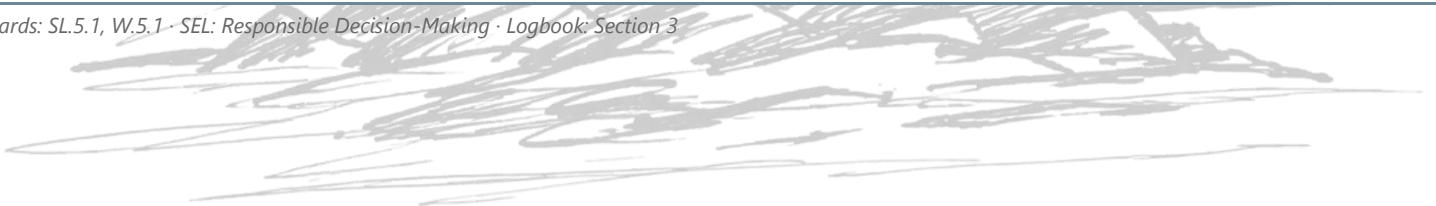
