Sara gives Jada a drawing of Jada herself - one of the first times Jada feels seen the way she usually sees others.

Being seen does not always mean being praised loudly. Sometimes it means someone notices who you are, what you carry, or how you help.

1. What does it mean to be seen for who you are, not only for what you do or what others expect from you?

2. Why does Sara's drawing matter so much to Jada? Use the story, your own thinking, or what "someone might" feel.

3. What is one way a person can help someone else feel truly seen? What actions demonstrate their words?
